THE CLASSIC (AGES 8-12) NON-RESIDENTIAL

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INCLUDED IN FEES (residential students)

Full board and accommodation, pastoral care, CHF 100 pocket money per week (any remaining balance is returned in cash on departure), residence tax, health and accident insurance, morning course tuition and all required materials, afternoon activities and evening events, 2-day expedition (camping or mountain hut experience, dependant on age), excursion days/ afternoons (1 every 2 weeks), use of school library, computer network and other resources, laundry service on set days, Aiglon t-shirt and gift bag, sports equipment, on-site health care, arrival and departure day shuttle service to Geneva airport between 08h00 and 17h00 (on official arrival and departure days only).

NOT INCLUDED IN FEES

Required clothing (Aiglon provides a list to advise on packing), transport to and from Geneva Airport outside the official arrival and departure dates, various personal expenses (SIM cards, stamps, toiletries, U.M. service, excess baggage, dry cleaning etc.), costs arriving from damage to property, insurance for personal items brought to Aiglon.



ADMISSION PROCESS

- » Online application
- » CHF 1'000 deposit (non-refundable). Payable within two weeks of application to reserve place
- » Remaining fee to be paid within 8 weeks of receiving the invoice
- » Submit current colour photo (head and shoulders only) via email
- » Submit travel form once travel arrangements are confirmed

MORNING COURSES

- » **'Classic' students (AGES 8-12):** Intensive English or Intensive French (Beginner to Advanced Course Level), Maths & Science Investigator Course, Performing Arts Course, Switzerland Explorer Course.
- » **'Challenger' students (AGES 13-15):** Intensive English or Intensive French (Beginner to Advanced Course Level), Maths & Science Investigator Course, Leadership Skills Course, Switzerland Explorer Course.
- » **'Eagle' students (AGES 16-17):** Intensive English or Intensive French (Beginner to Advanced Course Level), Business and Entrepreneurship, Leadership and Mountain Adventure Course, SAT Preparation.

AFTERNOON ACTIVITIES

Students rotate through a varied activity plan within a group of students the same age. They are assigned a group leader that accompanies them to all activities which may include: art, camp craft, team games, yoga, drama, raft-building, orienteering, hiking, swimming, bowling, climbing (indoor and outdoor), golf (crazy golf and driving range), cookery, face painting, ice skating, river rafting, canyoning (older students), bridge swing (younger students), water park, tennis, sailing, stand up paddle board, windsurfing, banana boat.

TRIPS & EXPEDITIONS

All students will take part in an overnight expedition, leaving campus for 2 days to explore our local Alpine environment. Nonresidential students will join the expedition for the daytime activities.

- » Students will have the chance to try an adventure activity such as rafting or a climbing course, along with hiking and pitching a tent. Expedition is an opportunity to enjoy working as a team, to then relax around the campfire!
- » Eagle students on the Business and Entrepreneurship and the Leadership and Mountain Adventure Courses will have an additional overnight trip to further extend their learning. The former focusing on a city visit with culture and exploration, and the latter involving map reading, hiking and more advanced campcraft skills.
- » Day excursions include visiting Lac Lemman and many of the beautiful lakeside towns and their famous sites, or the option of a day of horseriding.

BOARDING HOUSE LIFE

Students are allocated their boarding house based on gender, age and to include a diverse range of nationalities. Each boarding house has a live-in house team (house parent and two tutors) who manage the well-being of every student and are the first point of contact for parents. Rooms are spacious and are shared with two or three other students of a similar age.

MOBILE PHONE USE

We encourage students to make the most of their summer school opportunity and to be fully involved in the life of the community. To encourage this, phone use is allowed between 17h00 and 18h30 each day (during student free time) when they can call home. During the 2 day expedition, students will not have their phone.

PROGRAMME

A dedicated programme coordinator will look after the students as they transition between their various activities, oversee evening activities as well as helping to manage drop-off and pick-up for day students who are enrolled in the winter camp.

- » **Morning** - Aiglon offers a British curriculum programme including English and Maths as core subjects. Each day students will spend half of their day immersed in the Aiglon curriculum. Subjects are varied and typically include English, Maths, French, Geography, Science and Art.
- » **Afternoon** - Students will be part of a dedicated ski group to receive lessons in our beautiful ski area just behind the campus. Tuition is for 2 hours each afternoon, excluding the travel time to the piste.
- » **Evenings** - During the evening there is time for homework, and then social activities at the Junior School. If students are staying on for an additional week, the Sunday will be used for a social outing and enjoyable rest time in house.



BOARDING HOUSE LIFE

Students are allocated to a Junior School boarding house based on gender, and then will share a room with other students based on age. Each boarding house has a live in staff team who manage the well being of every student. Rooms are spacious and are typically shared with two or three other students.



MOBILE PHONE USE

Students may bring their mobile telephones however they must give these to Houseparents for safe keeping. Students may only use their mobile telephones in free time (generally this is from 17h00-18h30).

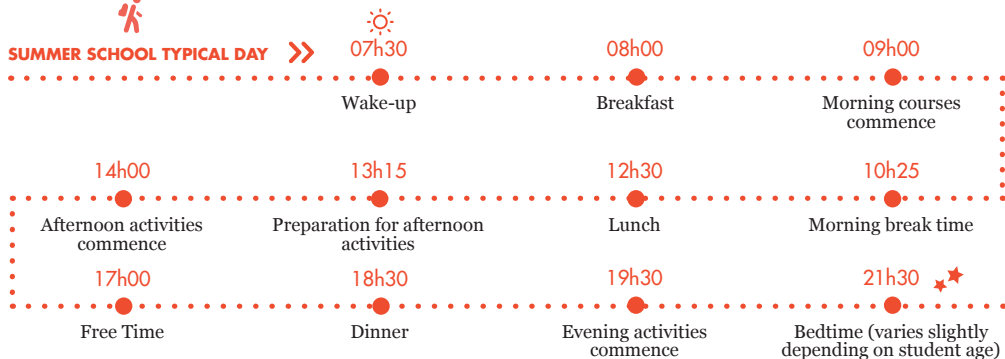


ADDITIONAL INFO

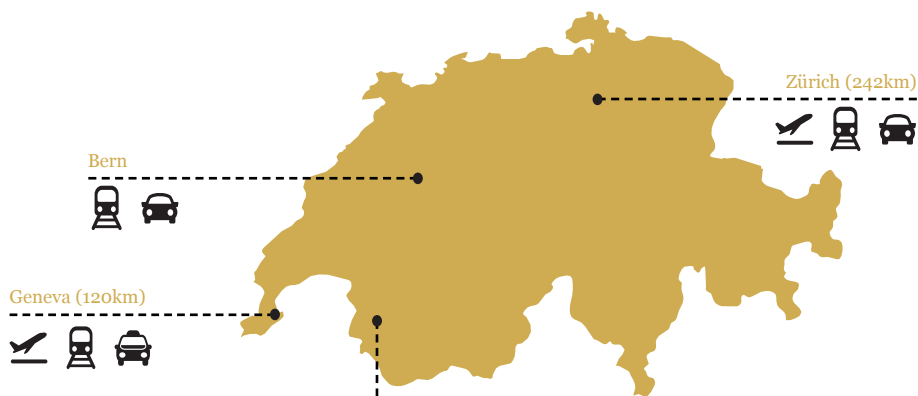
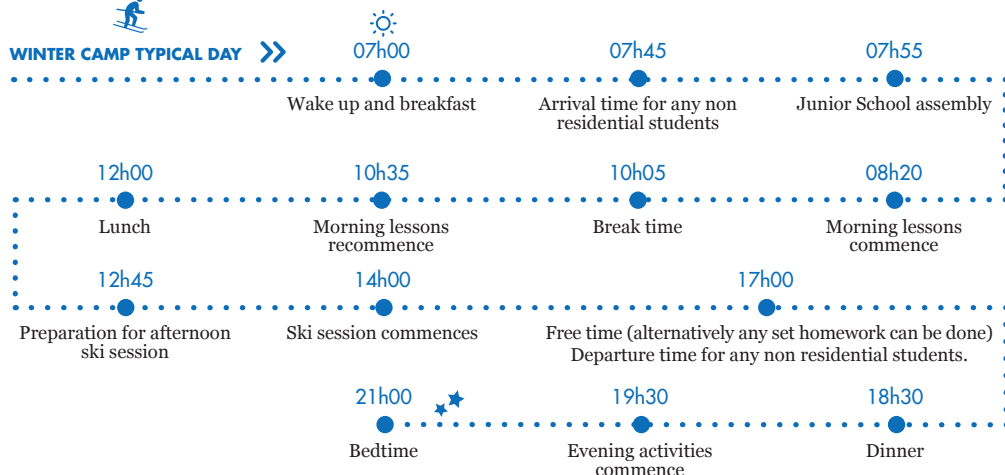
- » It is possible for Aiglon to arrange a shuttle collection from Geneva airport, the fee is CHF 300 per journey. An Unaccompanied Minor (UM) service is also available for CHF 600 per journey.
- » Private language lessons can be arranged on request, the fee is CHF 110 per hour.
- » The non-residential programme runs Monday - Friday from arrival at 07h45 until collection from Aiglon at 17h00.
